Why are my lecturers doing this?

Honestly, because we're at breaking point.

Members say they are working up to 70 hours a week and it's making them physically and mentally ill. Our wages have gone down 25% in a decade, and the worst pay and contracts still go to women, ethnically minoritised and disabled staff. We've tried talking. We've tried striking. All we want is to do a good job for the students we love, but we can't do that if we're sick and stressed.
